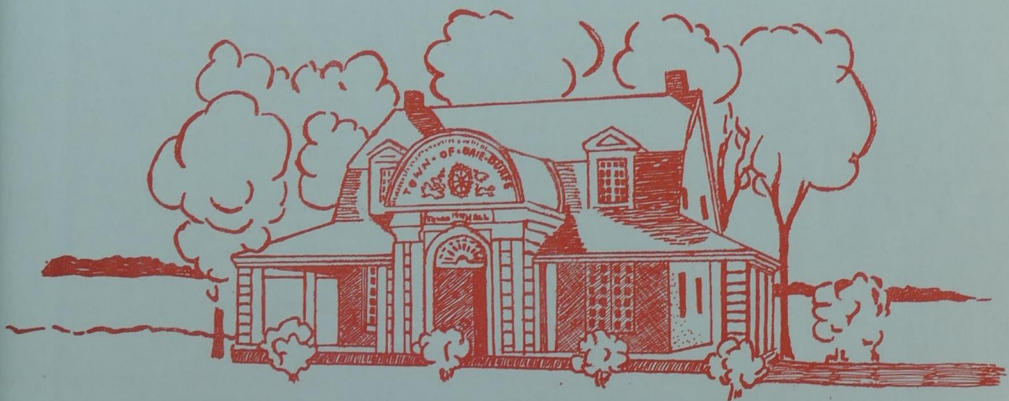

SCHOOL AFFAIRS

On Monday, July 5th, the School Trustees of Ste. Anne de Bout de l'Île held a special meeting at the Home of Mr. Walkinshaw for the purpose of electing a Trustee for the coming three years, Mr. Williamson's term of office having expired. A few members of the Citizens' Association were present and Mr. & Mrs. Milligan attended from Ste. Marie Road.

Mr. Holliday proposed that Mr. Case should act as chairman for the evening. As Mr. Williamson was willing to stay as trustee for another term of office he was nominated and after a lapse of one hour as no further nominations had been received he was elected.

During the 1 hour interval the opportunity was taken to explain to Mr. & Mrs. Milligan some of the regulations regarding the work of School Trustees and they were urgently invited to show an interest in school affairs and encourage others on Ste. Marie Rd. to do likewise.

On Friday, July 16th, two members of the School Affairs Committee attended the Central School Board Meeting at Macdonald High School. Only two other members of the Public were present. The Chairman (Mr. Angus) and Mr. Wm. Spriggs were absent. Mr. Farmer of Ste. Anne de Bellevue took the chair for the evening. The Secretary-Treasurer (Mr. Graham) reported that arrangements were being made to carry on group Insurance for Teachers. Mr. Butler reported that there was no further statement to make with regard to the agreement that Mr. Long, K.C., is preparing to place before McGill University. Mr. Butler did, however, give a little further information to those present explaining why the agreement drawn up by McGill had not been accepted. Chief items of dissatisfaction were:- Cost of Heating the School from the College Power House, the length of time that the agreement would hold and the fact that McGill would not guarantee the use of the Playing Fields.

The Secretary-Treasurer was instructed to order the necessary books and the Local School Trustees were to be asked to have their budgets prepared and presented to the Central Board by the next meeting, Friday, August 20th, at 8:30 p.m.
